Why are we exploring a women's cohort in PHACS?

- Large unique cohort of women with HIV in PHACS SMARTT (~2500 with about 250/year enrolling in SMARTT Dynamic)
 - Young women who have experienced pregnancy
 - Diverse group (e.g., age, geography, race, ethnicity, and in terms of when women learned their HIV status)
 - Opportunities with Coenrollment: SMARTT/AMP-UP
- Structure in place with SMARTT and AMP:Already collecting some data about women's health
- Caveat: No extra resources currently, but aiming to position ourselves for resources in future

- Women's Health concept sheets with existing data (3 by 3/2018)

Next Steps:

- Move concept sheets forward
- Create plan to expand how we could study women's health in PHACS

 - Learn from and explore partnering with WIHS Study
 - PHACS Spring Retreat
 - Expand team
