• MEETING MINUTES

The group accepted the minutes for December 11, 2008. **Tanisha** will post the minutes on the website.

• ADHERENCE TO ANTIRETROVIRAL MEDICATION IN AMP

Tanisha introduced **Kathy** from Harvard University. **Kathy** joined the call to talk about adherence to antiretroviral medications in AMP. **Kathy** is an epidemiologist. She works at the PHACS Data and Operations Center. The child and the caregiver are both interviewed about how the child takes his/her medications. When the child is interviewed, the site does not talk about HIV infection or HIV medications. Interviews are done at the 6-month follow-up visit, and then again once each year.

Kathy went through the slides that she created for the call. The slides show the answers to survey questions. These questions were asked to caregivers and children for the following areas:

- Last time child missed medication
- How often the child missed medication
- Top reasons for missing medicine
- Top memory aids

- The top three aids are activities of daily living, pill box and the buddy system
- Age and adherence
 - The data shows that as subjects get older, they tend to miss taking their medication more.
