 Advocacy is the support for or recommendation of a particular cause or policy.




Types of Advocacy


- "Behind-the-Scenes"

Advocacy in PHACS



- Mothers and Caregivers
- PHACS CAB
 - Purpose
 - Mission



- Each team will choose a buzzer sound (Beep! Buzz! Ding!, etc).
- Anyone on the team can make the buzzer sound when he/she knows the answer.
- Whichever team "buzzes" first will get 15 seconds to decide on the answer.

- Each team will have 1 team leader.
- The team leader the only person who can say the answer for the team after 15 seconds of team discussion.
- If the team answers incorrectly, the other team gets a chance to steal.

These are the three main PHACS protocols.



The goal of SMARTT is to study the long-term safety for babies who were exposed to them in the womb or after birth.



This PHACS group includes HIVaffected community members, health educators, study nurses, psychologists, epidemiologists, biostatisticians, researchers, and representatives from the National Institutes of Health.


This HECC resource is a tool for caregivers who have decided they want to disclose to their child.
