

Dear PHACS Investigators:

We are happy to share the news that a set of public use datasets have been prepared for the Adolescent Master Protocol (AMP) study of the Pediatric HIV/AIDS Cohort Study (PHACS) network, and are now available through the Data and Specimen Hub (DASH) repository maintained by the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development (NICHD).

Interested investigators and researchers can access these datasets at the following link: https://dash.nichd.nih.gov/study/17510

While anyone can view the overall description of the study and available datasets, investigators must create a login ID and will be required to sign a data use agreement in order to obtain access to these datasets. However, there is no charge for obtaining these datasets.

The AMP public use datasets include data submitted at the baseline visit and up through 2 years of follow up. We are in the process of preparing SMARTT datasets for deposit to the DASH repository as well, and anticipate that these would be available within the next 6-9 months.

Interested researchers should also be aware that the NICHD DASH repository now holds data and specimens for 94 different studies, over half of which relate to HIV research (including ATN, NISDI). Other non-HIV related studies may also be available to use as comparison cohorts. The general link to DASH is: https://dash.nichd.nih.gov/
